

# RANK YOUR IDEAS

Thanks to this activity you can make your students to order a list of items. This is useful to reflect, think and choose, about a certain topic to reach a decision

## FIRST STEP

A list with **ideas or statements** will be given.

Such ideas should have been previously developed by the course participants or the entire class (in a previous learning activity or proposed by the trainer).

## SECOND STEP

According to their experience and opinions,

they need to **score** on a scale **from 1 to 5** for each idea (comment should be proposed).

## THIRD STEP

Also **comments can be provided**

(this option can be mandatory trying a critical but positive assessment on the first option or general).

## FOURTH STEP

After the participation of all students,

the **ranking will be published and updated** according to the **final score**.

Literature students are requested to rank the following: Which is the most representative work of English literature?

"Beowulf"

Jane Austen's "Pride and Prejudice"

Geoffrey Chaucer's "The Canterbury Tales"
