Project results

Our EUROPEAN SUSTAINABILITY EXPERT (ESE) eCourse has been developed!

With a total of 9 units covering essential competencies - from business sustainability to ESG reporting and environmental legislation, the ESE eCourse provides PPTs & case studies, interactive diagrams & infographics, expert videos and assessment quizzes. The course is designed to support learners in achieving the intended learning outcomes identified in the Competence Matrix, ultimately qualifying them as European Sustainability Experts. Designed around the ESG reporting requirements and informed by the ESCO Classification and various international Skills Intelligence Reports, the course focuses on key transversal and technical skills relevant to business needs. The ESE eCourse in English will be accessible through the project platform by the end of April 2026, while the German, Italian, Portuguese and Romanian versions by the end of August 2026!

Partner activities and meetings

July 2025 – mid January 2026 the consortium held 5 online meetings, to check objectives and achievements, harmonise work, and continue with new tasks.



After we finished designing the content of the ESE eCourse, we focused our work on the Train-the-Trainer Programme, which is meant to support VET professionals to build their capacity to use and facilitate the SUSTAIN-EU Curriculum and eCourse in their training courses with trainees and companies.

Risks were continuously monitored and the risk register updated accordingly. The consortium performed dissemination activities, to better promote the objectives and outcomes of our project.

The partners successfully met in Matera (Italy) on 27-28 of January 2026, for a Transnational Partnership Meeting focused on reviewing progress and aligning on the next project phases.

Next steps

Since February to April 2026, our consortium will implement a Training Needs Analysis regarding the Train-the-Trainer Programme, and will develop the programme's content (a CPD Programme built on 24 hours and 6 modules).

We will also prepare to approach new stages: piloting the CPD Programme and implementing it on larger scale!
